PTFA

The PTFA Annual General Meeting (AGM) is being held on Tuesday 2nd March at 7.30pm in the staffroom. We invite all parents who can spare 1 hour on this night to come along and join our dedicated group.

Our meetings are held on the first Tuesday night of each month and are relaxed and informal. Our Principal, or Assistant Principal, and a School Council representative attend each meeting. The usual length of a meeting is 1 hour. All meetings are child free.

It's a great opportunity to meet other parents whilst at the same time helping our school.

RIDING TO SCHOOL

In accordance with DET guidelines and in recognition that a young child does not have the concentration, vision and judgement skills necessary to ride a bicycle safely in traffic, students below Year Four are not permitted to ride their bicycles to school. Only children in Grades 4 – 6 can ride to school.

The main points of our MGPS Riding to School Policy (approved by School Council) are:

1. Students who ride a bicycle to and from school must wear an Australian Standards Association approved helmet.
 2. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their children are able to ride safely before allowing them to ride to or from school. This is not Mountain Gate Primary School's responsibility.
 3. Bikes will be stored at school and whilst all care will be taken we cannot accept responsibility for theft or damage.
 4. For safety reasons and storage difficulties we also do not permit the riding of scooters to school. If a parent chooses to accompany younger children to school riding a scooter or bike these must be taken home as we do not have adequate storage facilities.
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ENTERING AND EXITING THE SCHOOL

All students and parents entering and exiting the school are reminded that they must use the pedestrian gates and paths and also use the school pedestrian crossings.

It is unnecessary and unsafe to walk through carparks especially as there are several alternative gates and paths around the school and the school crossing is a must, given the busy traffic at drop off and pick up times.

Parents are also asked to park around the school and **not to park in the staff carparks** or use them as a pick up or drop off zone please. There is ample space in the streets surrounding the school.

For the safety of all, could parents and students please follow this expectation.

FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTION

Parent contributions are now due. Many thanks to our parents who have paid their financial contribution for 2021. Please come and meet with Jenny Lamont (Business Manager) if you would like to arrange a payment plan. Parent payments are an essential source of funds for a school to operate effectively and enable us to provide the many programs and resources we provide for our students.

ANAPHYLAXIS – IMPORTANT PLEASE!

Please be aware that several of our students have extreme allergic reactions to some foods – especially nuts. We ask that you take this serious issue into consideration when you are packing your child's lunch box or sending food along for sharing. Whilst individual children are alert to particular triggers, we can all assist by reducing the likelihood of an anaphylactic episode by avoiding nuts being brought to school and encouraging students to use the anti-bacterial hand wash available in all classrooms.

COLLECTING CHILDREN FROM SCHOOL

When collecting your child from school for dental or medical appointments, parents will need to complete the sign out book at the office and then collect your child from the classroom. Please allow plenty of time to get to your appointment, as we are unable to call children to the office. We strive to keep classroom interruptions to a minimum to maximize student learning.

CSEF (Camps Sports and Excursions Fund)

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student misses out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. CSEF will be provided to eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

To be eligible for CSEF you must hold a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card valid on 27th January 2021 and a copy of the card must be supplied to the office with your application.

If you did not receive a form home with your child, please call past the office to collect one.

HEADLICE

We have had a number of head lice cases reported to the office this week. Over the weekend, please **take the time to thoroughly check** your children's hair. A weekly check followed by treatment if needed will then help to keep lice under control.

Children with head lice get this through no fault of their own; it is usually passed on by head-to-head contact. Controlling the head lice outbreaks can be done by weekly checks of your child's hair using conditioner (any cheap conditioner will do).

FINDING HEADLICE

Many lice do not cause an itch, so you have to look carefully to find them. Head lice are found on the hair itself and move to the scalp to feed. They have six legs, which end in a claw and rarely fall from the head. Louse eggs (also called nits) are laid within 1.5 cm. of the scalp and are firmly attached to the hair. They resemble dandruff, but can't be brushed off. Lice can crawl and hide.

The easiest and most effective way to find them is to follow these steps:

STEP 1: Comb any type of hair conditioner on to the dry, brushed (detangled) hair. This stuns the lice and makes it difficult for them to grip the hair or crawl and hide.

STEP 2: Now comb sections of the hair with a fine tooth, head lice comb.

STEP 3: Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue.

STEP 4: Look on the tissue and on the comb for lice and eggs.

STEP 5: Repeat the combing for every part of the head at least 4 or 5 times.

If head lice are found you must treat the hair with a solution that you can purchase from the chemist or supermarket. After treating the hair it is imperative that you remove all eggs from the hair (NO TREATMENT WILL KILL EGGS). You are then required to **retreat the hair in 7 to 10 days time. (Refer to instructions on product used)**

Please note that children with live lice are excluded from attending School until appropriate treatment has commenced.

GENERAL MEMBER

PRESIDENT

You will be required to chair a meeting each month. You will also be required to co-ordinate various fundraising activities during the year and delegate accordingly.

VICE PRESIDENT

This position is a backup for the president if in need of assistance and may be required to chair the monthly meeting during his/her absence.

SECRETARY

The secretary is required to record the minutes of each meeting, file them and to handle the correspondence. You may also be called upon for assistance by the president.

ASSISTANT SECRETARY
