PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities – provided on a user-pays basis

Mountain Gate Primary School offers a range of optional items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides to deliver the Curriculum.

Parents and Guardians will be invited to access these activities and items on a user-pays basis throughout the 2024 school year.



Financial Support for Families

Mountain Gate Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of schools trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold an eligible Pension or Health Care Card or are foster parents you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school for use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. CSEF cannot be used for Curriculum Contributions or Uniforms. The Annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students. Applications will be sent home at the start of the year and will be in our newsletter.
- State Schools Relief (SSR)
 Foundations students eligible for CSEF will receive a Uniform package mid-year via State Schools
 Relief.
- Payment plans for Extra-Curricular Items and Activities
 Payment plan options will be available for Extra-Curricular activities on Compass or by request.
- Other financial support options for families
 Mountain Gate Primary School has established partnerships with welfare and support agencies to assist our families.
